Raul A. Alvarez
Case No. 2015-050254

The Florida Board of Architecture and Interior Design agreed to enter a final order approving a settlement stipulation imposing reprimand, a \$2,500.00 fine plus costs and two years probation against Raul A. Alvarez’s license to practice architecture. Mr. Alvarez signed and sealed deficient plans and the client was required to hire another architect to complete the project. Further, Mr. Alvarez’s title block is in violation.

Tony L. Benton
Case No. 2015-051001

The Florida Board of Architecture and Interior Design agreed to enter a final order approving a settlement stipulation imposing a fine of \$1,000.00 plus costs, forty eight hours of continuing education and suspension until compliance against Tony L. Benton’s license to practice architecture. Mr. Benton affirmed at renewal that he had completed the required continuing education credits. Mr. Benton was chosen for the audit and has not provided proof of any continuing education hours obtained during the audit period.

Bobby Wayne Bishop
Case No. 2016-009245

The Florida Board of Architecture and Interior Design agreed to enter a final order approving a settlement stipulation imposing a fine of \$250.00 plus costs, nine hours of continuing education within 90 days against Bobby Wayne Bishop’s license to practice architecture. Mr. Bishop affirmed at renewal that he had completed the required continuing education credits. Mr. Bishop was chosen for the audit and has provided only twenty one hours of continuing education during the audit period.

E. Dean Bolaris
Case No. 2015-049072

The Florida Board of Architecture and Interior Design agreed to enter a final order imposing a fine of \$2,000.00 plus costs and two years probation against E. Dean Bolaris’s license to practice architecture. Mr. Bolaris prepared drawings for a residential addition. The plans were rejected by the building department and Mr. Bolaris never corrected the drawings.

Case No. 2016-007858

The Florida Board of Architecture and Interior Design agreed to enter a final order approving a settlement stipulation imposing a fine of \$250.00 plus costs and seven hours of continuing education within 90 days against Dava Bronstein's license to practice interior design. Ms. Bronstein affirmed at renewal that she had completed the required continuing education credits. Ms. Bronstein was chosen for the audit and has only provided eighteen hours of continuing education during the audit period.

Jorge L. Estevanez
Case No. 2016-007983

The Florida Board of Architecture and Interior Design agreed to enter a final order approving a settlement stipulation imposing a fine of \$500.00 plus costs, twenty one hours of continuing education within 120 days against Jorge L. Estevanez's license to practice architecture. Mr. Estevanez affirmed at renewal that he had completed the required continuing education credits. Mr. Estevanez was chosen for the audit and has provided only fifteen hours of continuing education during the audit period.

The Florida Board of Architecture and Interior Design agreed to enter a final order approving a settlement stipulation imposing a fine of \$250.00 plus costs, eleven hours of continuing education within 90 days against Michael Gargano's license to practice architecture. The Florida Board of Architecture and Interior Design agreed to enter a final order approving a settlement stipulation imposing a fine of \$1,000.00 plus costs, forty eight hours of continuing education and suspension until compliance against Charles L. Hailey, II's license to practice architecture. Mr. Hailey affirmed at renewal that he had completed the required continuing education credits. Mr. Hailey was chosen for the audit and has not provided proof of any continuing education hours obtained during the audit period.
