Catherine Baker
Case No. 2020-031971

The Florida Board of Architecture and Interior Design agreed to enter a final order accepting a voluntary relinquishment of Catherine Baker’s license to practice interior design.

Alan Esparza
Case No. 2021-030189

The Florida Board of Architecture and Interior Design agreed to enter a final order imposing a fine of \$2,000.00 plus costs and a reprimand against Alan Esparza. Mr. Esparza is licensed to practice architecture and received a retainer of \$3,900.00 and has never produced any drawings.

Janet Gruenwald
Case No. 2020-043118

The Florida Board of Architecture and Interior Design agreed to enter a final order imposing a fine of \$1,000.00 plus costs, 48 hours of continuing education and suspension until compliance against Janet Gruenwald’s license to practice architecture. Ms. Gruenwald affirmed at renewal that she had completed the required hours and did not provide any hours of continuing education during the audit period.

Michael Kelley

The Florida Board of Architecture and Interior Design agreed to enter a final order imposing a fine of \$500.00 plus costs against Michael Kelley license to practice architecture. Mr. Kelley is licensed to practice architecture but he was practicing on a delinquent license.

Matthew Konar
Case No. 2020-052479

The Florida Board of Architecture and Interior Design agreed to enter a final order approving a settlement stipulation imposing a fine of \$1,000.00 plus costs, 48 hours of continuing education and suspension until compliance against Matthew Konar's license to practice architecture. Mr. Konar affirmed at renewal that he had completed the required hours and did not provide any hours of continuing education during the audit period.

Gerald Nyren
Case No. 2020-044526

The Florida Board of Architecture and Interior Design agreed to enter a final order approving a settlement stipulation imposing a fine of \$500.00 plus costs and 18.5 hours of continuing education against Gerald Nyren's license to practice architecture. Mr. Nyren affirmed at renewal that he had completed the required hours and only provided 17.5 hours of continuing education during the audit period.
